1 General Information

The OpenScape 4000 "Application Administration" application is needed to install, replace, and remove applications. In addition, you can display the names of the installed applications and the installation packages that are on the installation medium. DVDs, CDs, and the installation directory on the OpenScape hard disk can be used as installation media.

A list of the applications which can be installed or replaced from the installation medium is displayed when installing or replacing applications. If you are using a DVD or CD as the installation medium, the applications that you choose will be copied to the installation directory on the hard disk and installed from there. You may also install applications directly from the installation directory that is on the hard disk.

The Application Installer is normally used to to administer applications which

- are either unknown to the software activation component

or

- which are customized variants of applications that were installed under the same name by the software activation component, too, and are now being updated.

Once an application has been modified on the installation directory by the Application Installer, it can no longer be updated via software activation (using PP or RLC activation).

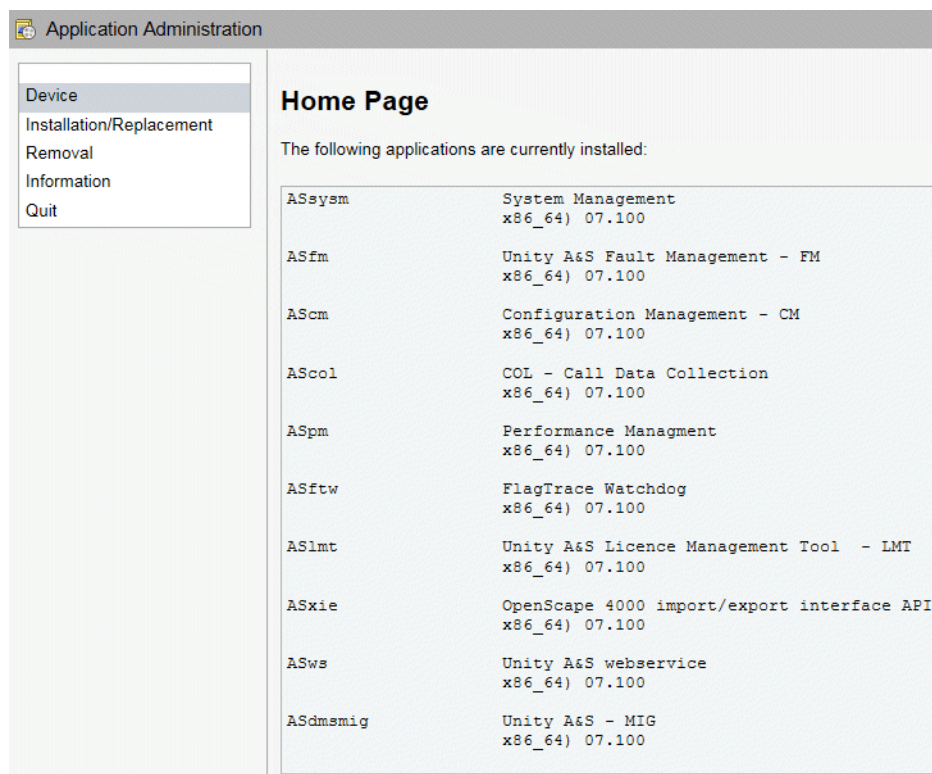
2 Starting the Application

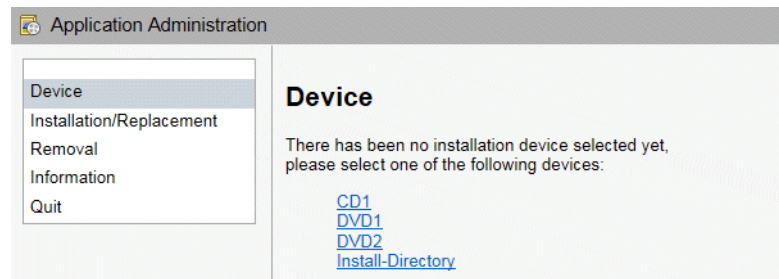

4.1 Device

Use the "Device" function to select the installation medium.

If no device has been selected for installation/update, you are presented with the following message: "There has been no installation device selected yet, please select one of the following devices: ...".



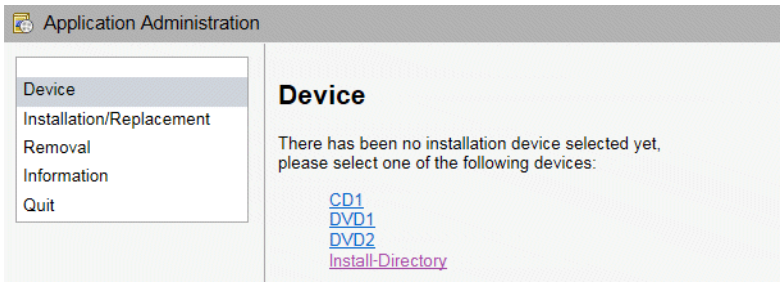
You receive a confirmation message after you select the appropriate device.

If you return to the device selection screen later, the device that is currently selected for installation/update is displayed ("The currently registered installation device is: ...").



4.2 Installation/Replacement

The "Installation/Replacement" function allows you to select the applications that can be installed or replaced from the device that you just selected. The device selection procedure is automatically activated if you have not selected a device yet.

Installation/Replacement

Please select the application you want to newly install or replace by a customer-specific version.

You may select either one individual application or all available applications.

The installation or replacement starts as soon as you have selected the application. The components to be installed are first saved temporarily in an auxiliary directory and then installed on the install/replaced on the install directory.

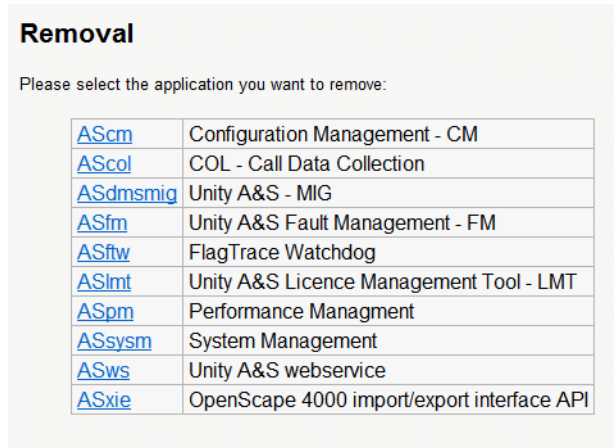
When the installation has completed successfully, the following message appears:

"The application has been successfully installed/replaced."

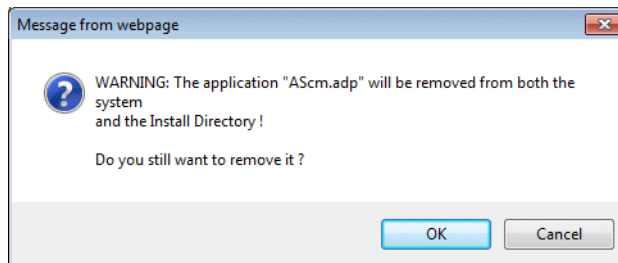
If the installation was not successful, you receive an error message (see [Error Message](#)).

4.3 Removal

Use the "Removal" function to remove individual applications.



After you have selected the application that you want to remove, you are asked if you really want to remove it. Furthermore, you are notified that the application will also be removed from the install directory on the hard disk.



After successful removal, a selection list containing the applications that are still installed is displayed. You can now select another application.

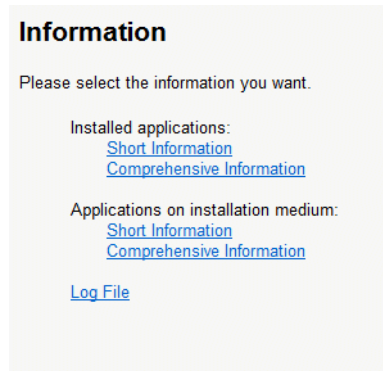
If you want to reinstall an application you can choose one of the following options:

- Reinstall all applications as "typical" (i.e. not customer-specific)
- Restore from a previous backup copy
- Installation of a specific "customer-specific version" of the application using the Application Installer (external data medium)

4.4 Information

The "Information" function allows you to display different information.

If necessary, the device selection procedure will automatically be activated if you have not selected a device yet.

Error Message

The following three error messages are possible:

- Error while transferring a package from the installation medium to the install directory
(see log file for details)
- Error while determining the installation sequence
(see log file for details)
- Error while installing a package on the system
(see log file for details)

Standard Toolbar

The standard toolbar contains the following icons:

	Help button	Opens the online help and displays the help index.
	Home button	Links to APP homepage
	Start button	Opens a new browser window which displays the start page of the OpenScape 4000 Assistant / Manager. All applications which can be accessed by the presently logged in user are listed there.
	Logoff button	Logs off the current user, closes the running session for all associated browser windows and returns to the login screen.

Information displayed

Only information about the **HP4KMgr/app** category applications is displayed. (The short (comprehensive) information is the result of the modifications of the Linux call `rpm -q (rpm -qi)`.)

- **NAME**
Short name of the application
- **VERSION**
Version of the application
- **RELEASE**
Release number of the application
- **DATE**
Installation date of the application
- **GROUP**
OpenScape recognizes two categories (groups) of applications: **HP4KMgr/app** and **HP4KMgr/platform**. Applications in either category (group) can be installed with the **Software Activation (SWA)** application.

The Application Administration administers applications in the **HP4KMgr/app** category only.

Possible values: **HP4KMgr/app**

- **SIZE**
Size of the application in bytes
- **SIGNATURE**
If the package is signed, information on the encryption used for signing is displayed.

- **PACKAGER**
Name of the tool used to create the rpm package of the application
- **SUMMARY**
Long name of the application
- **DESCRIPTION**
Short description of the application - mostly the same as Summary
- **DISTRIBUTION**
Name of the product (and its version) the application is distributed with
- **RELOCATIONS**
The application's possibility to be relocated (i.e. to be moved to/installed at another location selected by the user)
- **VENDOR**
Manufacturer holding the copyright for the software
- **BUILD DATE**
Production date of the rpm package
- **BUILD HOST**
Hostname of the server where the rpm package was produced
- **SOURCE RPM**
Source name of the rpm file
- **LICENSE**
List of software licence(s) you have to agree to for using the application
